# UNESCO Creative Cities Network



On World Cities Day 2023, 55 cities join the UNESCO Creative Cities Network (UCCN), following their designation by UNESCO Director-General Audrey Azoulay. New cities were acknowledged for their strong commitment to harnessing culture and creativity as part of their development strategies and for displaying innovative practices in human-centred urban planning. With the latest additions, the Network now counts 350 cities in more than one hundred countries, representing seven creative fields: **Crafts and Folk Art, Design, Film, Gastronomy, Literature, Media Arts and Music.**






