

The 15th edition of the International Festival of Contemporary Theatre Homo Novus will take place on 5-13 September in Riga with the programme of Japan Focus, guest performances, scenography exhibition, festival school 'Memory of Place', and 'Sonic Dawn' – a festival within a festival that will last for 7 hours on 7 September's night and will explore our listening skills.

The International Festival of Contemporary Theatre Homo Novus is known for promoting contemporary performing arts, humanist values and critical thinking among Latvian artists and audiences alike. "Japan Focus" is one of the central programmes of the festival in 2019, where Japanese artists/collectives are invited to collaborate with Latvian artists to codevelop new works based on Riga's historical, social and cultural contexts.

Through <u>Mobility First!</u>, ASEF is supporting the mobility of 5 Asian artists and theatre professionals to be involved in the International Festival of Contemporary Theatre Homo Novus 2019 from 5 to 13 September 2019 in Riga, Latvia.


