

On 25 January 2024 IETM's will hold its yearly policy event online, which will focus on climate justice and the performing arts while drawing knowledge from the recently released publication Climate Justice: Through the Creative Lens of the Performing Arts.


The publication reflects and explores various aspects of climate justice, offers an overview of current literature and shares examples and practices from different contexts through a worldwide peer to peer consultation. The research drew from the key takeaways and discussions of three regional focus groups, including ones taking place in Asia.
