Frieze Writer's Prize 2016, the annual international award to discover and promote new art critics, is now open for entries. The winner will be commissioned to write a review for *frieze* and will be awarded GBP £2,000. Entries invited from aspiring art critics worldwide, submissions in English language.

This year the prize will be judged by *frieze* assistant editor Paul Clinton, writer Olivia Laing, and writer and artist James Bridle.

Aspiring art critics are invited to submit one unpublished review of a recent contemporary art exhibition, which should be 700 words in length.

Entries should be emailed as a Word attachment to writersprize@frieze.com.

Guidelines for submissions

- Entries must be submitted in English, but may be translated (this must be acknowledged).
- Entrants must be over 18 years of age at the time of submission.
- Entrants are allowed a maximum of three previously published pieces of writing on art.

The closing date for entries is 18 July 2016

- Olivia Laing is a writer and critic, based in Cambridge. She's the author of *To the River*, *The Trip to Echo Spring* and *The Lonely City: Adventures in the Art of Being Alone* (all published by Canongate). She writes for the *Guardian*, *Observer*, *New Statesman* and *The New York Times* and is a regular columnist for *frieze*.
- **Paul Clinton** is a writer and assistant editor of *frieze* and *Frieze Masters*. He has taught on art, stupidity and queer theory at Goldsmiths College and the University of Manchester. Previous publications include a special issue of *parallax* on stupidity and articles on Bonnie Camplin and Gustav Metzger. He was also a founding member of the band No Bra. He recently co-curated the exhibition 'duh? Art & Stupidity' at Focal Point Gallery, Southend-on-Sea (2015–2016).
