It was founded in 1904 as one of the first trade union for professional actors in the world. As a trade union it is the mission of the Danish Actors Association to look after its members' interests in a wide number of areas, including:

- Collective agreements relating to pay and employment conditions for actors working in theatres, radio, film and television.
- Protection of the performances of artists through legislation and collective agreements.
- Improvement of the conditions under which artists work by exercising an influence on cultural politics.
- Looking after its members' social and educational needs.
