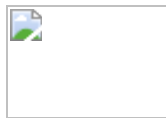
Main functions:

 - to promote the creation of films, as well as the availability and distribution of audiovisual heritage in Latvia and around the world;
 - to co-ordinate the participation of film industry of Latvia in European support programmes for the audio-visual field;
 - to register film producers;
 - to supervise the fulfilment of the provisions for the classification of films; and
 - to perform other functions specified in the regulatory enactments in the field of cinema.
